FEBRUARY MEETING PROJECTS

At our February meeting we will be:

- Making boobos (injury packs)
 - Sewing liners
 - Filling with rice
 - Sewing covers
- Adding ribbons to the ears of April's bunny hats
- Cutting out sleepers, onesies, gowns as needed
- Cutting out June strawberry hats
- Stuffing boppees
- Other projects as needed

DO YOU HAVE FABRIC SCRAPS?

If you have fabric scraps you would like to use up, we will be making boobo injury packs at our next meeting and can use your help.

- Cotton or knit: cut into 4" x 5" pieces. These can be folded over the long way and sewed on the two short sides, leaving the top open.
- Flannel or polar fleece: Cut into 6" x 7" pieces. Do not sew at home until we have the pattern to be used. These will be sewed at our meeting into covers for the smaller rice filled "pillows".
- Bring any you have cut or sewed to our February 13 workgroup meeting.

Booboo injury packs are small rice-filled pillows that can be stored in a refrigerator or freezer. When a little one gets a "booboo", this soft, colorful pillow can be pulled out of the cold to put on the hurt. That and a mommy's kiss help that booboo feel much better quickly.
